Your letter - also dear Mrs Wardall's - met me here - I had, a magnificent audience in the Opera Rink (Rink?) on Friday evening - and last evening I heard Mrs. Barker speak - she gave her trite statement that the saloon makes criminals - gives nothing in return for the money paid it - and closed with answering til (til?) objections urged against women's voting. I was disappointed - in that her talk was all from the mans stand-point - I long to de cry woman supplement man - To echo him - or duplicate him!!

She is a good speaker though not- what is called a magnetic speaker. Your executive committee & superintendents, officers of the W E S A will never supplant her - or make the women of the state feel that she is not the greatest & best woman for your President. So long as each & all of you stay at home - and she visits women in their homes- and speaks to the people every county every year - and your Madison Cou. will be repeated over & over unless some of you - put on your bonnets & make the women of the state acquainted with your powers & your virtues - and scores of you have both of these essentials - but they must not be hid under the bushel measure - if the friends know of them -

Well I speak to night in the Opera Rink (Rink?) - and take the train 5: October A. M. for Aberdeen. Stayed there all night - & Tuesday go to Bowdle where I speak that night - & Wednesday drive to Mound City - & speak there that night & Thursday A. M. Mrs O'horon; myself drive to Banyon & speak to such of the people as haven't gone to the fair at - Mound City-

I enclose to you a check for \$100 - and I want you to use it - to pay the <u>organizers</u> - Mrs Bradley - Carrington -Sietz - et aljust in accordance with your best judgement - I also enclose a \$50. check to Mr. DeVoe - which I want you to pay him for your board also for Mr. Bailey as far as it will go - At \$4 a week - eachit will cover over a little over <u>five</u> weeks - and be assured that if money does not come from the county (county?) and local societies - I will see that your board is paid up to the end of the campaign and a week after -- it should take the office to Nov. 10. 11 or 12 -

I shall return to Huron from the Black Hills at once after the election - and I want you to do the same & call an Ex. Com. meeting - so that we can close up our month in ship-shape -

There ought to be a meeting's of the real working officers of all county & local societies - in Huron before I leave the state which will be on the 9th at latest - as I must be in Omaha to attend the Nebraska Natl Convention on Nov. 11th hence all I say or do in South Dakota must be before Nov.9th

This for both you & Mrs Wardall --- The Ipswich collections were over \$90 - they said they should send \$10 - \$15 - at once.

It does seem very strange that the societies all over the state feel so little responsibility about helping to pay the expenses of their state work -

But - write cash & urge the friends everywhere to help - The W.E.S.A. raised 8 pledges guessing over \$200 - a paltry sum for their 100 sessions - pledging five-dollars each would amount to \$500 - and no man's society or laity or church would think of getting off with \$5. so there's still reorganization -
